

Financial Report

Offerings for October = \$21,905 (down 10.3% or \$2,517) Year-to-date \$216,405 (up 7.4% or \$14,907) Expenses for October = \$19,390 (down 22% or \$5,459) Year-to-date \$209,815 (down 8.7% or \$20,033)



The continued savings due to the interim pastoral payroll situation have allowed

us to begin building a bit of a cash reserve in the general fund despite the rising utility and insurance costs. The One Board studied financial results comparing 2019 through 2023 to identify trends in giving as well as categories of expenses. Careful thought will be needed to build a 2024 budget that prioritizes the impact of our ministry within the boundaries of our historical levels of contributions.
