Thank you for your faithful and energized support in the month of August. We continue to see improvements and gains in the financial health of our church.

The month's offerings for August were up by \$6,135 or 44%; while year-to-date offerings are \$16,706 or 10.5% ahead of 2022. We saved \$8,261 in expenses in August versus last August and year-to-date expenses are down by \$12,650 or 7%. Savings from the pastoral change in the second half of the year are driving the reduction in expense. All monthly apportionments/tithes were paid to the conference in August. The building fund offerings for the year are \$13,547 versus spending of \$17,707.



Love is Being Like Jesus

"If it is not love, it is not of God". The radical notion that we have to love people the same way Jesus did – forgive them like Jesus, not condemn them like Jesus... it is SO hard to do!

Linus in Peanuts had a line that resonates with me; "I love humanity, its people I can't stand!"

Loving in the abstract is not love.

Love is going above and beyond, it is acceptance without judgment, it is more a DOING than a FEELING.

We don't have to feel all warm and fuzzy to say we love someone. Love is when you get up in the middle of the night, when you really don't want to, to go help. It is giving more than you feel like you should when someone else is in need. It is doing the boring stuff, sometimes just showing up and being there.

My sister always wants to help; if there is an issue, she works hard to offer a solution. But sometimes love is just listening, hearing with the heart. I like the options offered by one parent; "Do you want some workable options? Do you want my opinion? Do you just need me to listen?"

Love is all of the above – sometimes options are needed, practical help. Sometimes frank discussion is needed, to work out the issue. Sometimes just listening is needed.

Love is being like Jesus. Not condemning. Not criticizing. Not holding on to hurt.

Reread I Corinthians 13, remembering that love is the greatest of all the great things God has for us – and that we have for each other.

Starting a Ripple Effect

Shortly before his death, 80-year-old farmer Hody Childress asked his daughter to continue a practice he'd quietly conducted for years: taking a \$100 bill to a local pharmacist on the first of every month. For years, Childress anonymously came to the aid of neighbors in Geraldine, Ala-

bama, who couldn't afford medications. "Don't tell a soul where the money came from," he instructed store owner Brooke Walker. "If they ask, just tell them it's a blessing from the Lord."

Thanks to the farmer's generosity, Walker could fill prescriptions for about 24 uninsured or underinsured people each year. "I was honored he allowed me to do that," she said, "and it really encouraged me to do the same in my life."

Childress wasn't wealthy but "always gave what he could," said daughter Tania Nix. "I think he felt like he couldn't not give," she added. "Giving that way, that just got on his heart." After word spread about Childress' generosity, other people were inspired to perform stealth outreach and a fund was established in his name.

A man in Oklahoma who shares Childress' surname said a story about the farmer caught his attention. They're probably not related, he wrote, but he'd feel proud if they were. "A man like that surely tried to follow the example of Jesus," the Oklahoman wrote, and "[his] story inspires me to be a better man."
