Blessed by Nate Steury's Visit

We were blessed again this year with Nate Steury's return visit to remind us again of the mission work the Kafakumba Training Center does in Zambia. We probably are most familiar with the Kafakumba Pastor's School that we contribute to in our mission budget. Back in the early 2000's, David Harrold took a group from our church on a mission trip to visit this mission. Our church worked with the Nappanee Rotary Club to provide well-drilling equipment that has dug many wells in Zambia. Nate reported that each well has bettered the lives of many people with the blessings of clean, safe, and available water.

Besides the water and wells ministry, Nate shared updates on the various missions of Kafakumba:

*The Kafakumba Pastor's School trains pastors by providing opportunities for men and women to be educated to become pastors. After 8 years of training for 6 weeks each summer, they become ordained pastors in the United Methodist Church to serve churches in Zambia and other African countries. Many pastors bring their families, with Bible studies and activities provided for the wives and children.

*The Kafakumba Christian School is now up to 7th grade. They have added a grade each year since beginning with K-3 a few years ago. There are also opportunities for us to sponsor a child in the school for

\$30 a month.

*God's Kids is an after school program, helping students with their homework and teaching Bible lessons.

*Kafakumba Clinic is excited that for the first time they have a fulltime doctor, Dr Longo Wangala Farady. He has been a medical general practitioner for 18 years with experience in surgery, obstetric, gynecology, pediatric and internal medicine.

*Kafakumba also serves as a conference and retreat center providing space like Epworth Forest in our area.

Nate even invited us to retire in Zambia at the Acacia Estates Retirement Center. Go to Nate Steury's Facebook page to see this beautiful building. Wouldn't that be a fun place to retire!

Remember to give to the Pastor's School which is a part of our mission budget. You can also donate to the Clinic or the School or the well-drilling mission. Just indicate this on your offering envelope. This ministry always seems to me to be an efficient and creative ministry whose true mission is to transform lives for Jesus Christ in Zambia.

Seeing the heartbreaking devastation on Maui is hard. But we can do something about it.

Lahaina United Methodist Church has been burnt to the ground – as have many other worshipping spaces and hundreds of businesses and homes.

Rather than donating to other reputable organizations, that often take as much as 80% of donations for administrative cost, you can donate through the church. <u>UMCOR</u> (United Methodist Commission on Relief) guarantees that 100% of donations go directly to where they are aimed – administrative costs are paid through our annual apportionments, given by every United Methodist Church.

UMCOR is one of the first groups "on the ground," ready with immediate help. UMCOR is one of the last to leave a disaster, knowing that the repercussions last far beyond the initial trauma and loss.

Want to help effectively? We can respond, quickly and effectively. Make out a check to Nappanee UM Church, mark Hawaii in the memo line, and we will gather it together and send out a check to UMCOR from the church.

This is a part of being there for others.

UMCOR Responds to Maui Disaster and More

Even as we continue to learn more about the wildfire disaster on Maui, we hear on the news of Hurricane Hilary beating on the coast of southern California. In fact, I heard on the news this morning (Aug. 21) that this latest event is the 15th major disaster in the United States already this year and FEMA is running out of money.

As Christians, our hearts ask how can we help? Our first thoughts should be to pray, and then to help by giving through UMCOR. We are often reminded that 100% of donations to UMCOR go directly to where they are aimed. Administrative costs are paid through our annual apportionments.

Now you have a choice to make. If you like, you can give to a specific disaster such as Hawaii, or give to the UMCOR US Disaster Fund. This way the funds are available for wherever they are needed most, even to smaller disasters that hardly make the news, but need help to recover.

Whatever you choose to do, make out a check to Nappanee UM Church, indicating on the memo line or on your offering envelope where you'd like it to go. Write 'UMCOR Hawaii' or 'UMCOR US Disaster Fund.' As Pastor Mary said, 'This is a part of being there for others.'

Financial Update

Imagine an airplane leaving from Los Angeles flying direct to Rome, Italy. The flight will take about 12 hours if the plane goes in a direct and straight line.

But, if the nose of the airplane is pointed just 1 degree off course to the

south, after 12 hours the plane will land somewhere in Tunisia, Africa! If there is a one degree difference to the north the plane might land in Slovenia or Austria!

A tiny difference in direction has a huge effect in outcome over a long distance.

As a church, we are making progress on the direction we want to go. Each degree of course correction makes an impact. In July, we experienced strong offerings and cost savings – it is exciting to be able to re-

port on a great month financially. We should celebrate, but not rest on our laurels. We have degrees to go to meet our goal of financial sustainability and I am honored to be along for the ride!

July Offerings \$25,351 – YTD offerings \$156,601 up \$10,551 or 7.22%

July Expenses \$18,256 – YTD expenses \$142,179 down \$4,389 or 3%
