It's Shoebox Time Again!

As we have been doing since 2009, each year our church has been filling shoeboxes for kids around the world as a way to show them God's love in a tangible way. That first year the FROG kids (anyone remember what FROG stood for?) filled them as a mission project during their time together before WOW on Wednesdays.

That first year they filled 43 boxes, and each year since then, we've filled many boxes, with the most completed in 2015 when we did 125 boxes.

This year Shoebox Sunday will be on October 30, and November 13 will be the Sunday we bring them to the church to celebrate. Although things have not changed much through the years, we might need a few reminders on how to fill our boxes.

First, remember that this is a one-to-one ministry. Even though Samaritan's Purse will distribute **over 9,500,000** boxes this year, each box goes to a specific child that needs to know about Jesus and God's love for him/her. So keeping that child in mind, keep him/her in prayer.

Pick up your box at the table in the narthex, along with a 'How to Pack a Shoebox' brochure. This will guide you as you choose items for your child. Remember to select a 'wow' item appropriate for the age and gender you choose. Also include personal care items (such as a toothbrush and washcloth), school supplies, and useful or fun items. There will be a few items available to help you complete your box next to the display table. Please use these items. You can also bring items so others can use them.

It's important that you personalize your box with a picture of you or your family. Also, there are papers available to complete to tell them about yourself. That way they will know that you are a 'real' person that cares about them.

AND remember the 'Build a Shoebox online' option. You can send the Gospel to a child somewhere in the world without leaving home. This is the easiest option and maybe the least expensive. For \$25.00, your box will be filled with quality items and includes the shipping fee. We hope to get a link set up to help you go directly to our online goal page from our church's website. Watch for more information in the weekly bulletin.

As you prayerfully prepare your box or boxes, pray that through your box a child will learn about "God's Greatest Gift," Jesus.

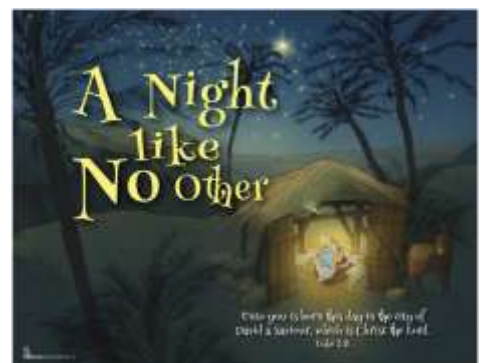
